Born 1589, the son of Robert Semple of Craigbait, Renfrewshire, and Grizel Montgomery or Cunningham; nephew of Colonel William Semple; joined Society of Jesus, Province of Toledo, 1615; died in Colegio Imperial, Madrid, 13th September 1654.
- 2. ANDREW YOUNGSON (or YOUNG or JUNIO). September 1654 to April 1655. See Madrid Students' List, no. 13.
- 3. ADAM LAURENCE GORDON. April 1655 to February 1656. Born in Auchmathy, Buchan (or in Cults, Strathbogie), c. 1616, the son of George Gordon and Isabel Leesk; entered S c o t s College, Douai, 7th December 1627 (in Poetry); in Scotland, April to No vember 1631; returned to Douai, 1631 (for Philosophy); soldier in France, in Lord James Douglas' Scottish regiment, perhaps between 1631 and 1635; to Scots College, Rome, October 1635 (for Philosophy); entered Society of Jesus, 1636; brought students to Madrid, 1647; rector of Scots College, Rome, 27th May 1652 to August 1655; rector at Madrid, as above; missionary in Scotland, 1657 to 1665; rector of Scots College, Douai, March 1666 to 8th April 1668; died at Douai, 8th April 1668.
- 4. FREDERICK MAXWELL (or ESCOTO). 18th February 1656 to December 1659. See Madrid Students' List, no. 2.
- 5. WILLIAM GRANT. 1659 to 1665. Native of Strathspey? to Scots College, Douai, 28th July 1620 (?); joined Society of Jesus in Tournai or in Spain, c. 1626; missionary in northern Scotland in 1641 and in 1646 (and perhaps from 1635 to 1658); rector at Madrid, as above; died in Scotland, 8th October 1689 (?).
- 6. JAMES ANDERSON. 1665 to 1692. born in Strathbogie, c. 1611; entered Scots College, Douai, July 1632 (for Poetry); joined Society of Jesus in Tournai, 1636; master, procurator and rector of the seminary (Douai ?); rector of the Scots College, Douai, 8th May 1653 to 8th May 1656; missionary in Scotland for many years (1656 to 1665 ?); rector at Madrid, as above.

Born at Aberdeen, 17th March 1674, the son of William Fyff and Helen Gordon; at Scots College, Douai, 10th December 1691 to 25th September 1693; joined Society of Jesus, Province of Naples, 29th January 1694; taught, and completed studies, at Naples; taught Humanities at Benevento and was subminister in College of Nobles, Naples; rector of Scots College, Rome, 11th November 1708 to 15th October 1712; rector at Madrid, as above; rector of Scots College, Douai, 1718 to 1721 and 1736 to 1739; procurator of Scottish mission at Paris, 1730 to 1733 (or 1736); was in Scotland (probably Galloway), August 1741; died in Luxembourg, 15th November 1746. (Cf. Sommervogel, *Bibliothèque de la Compagnie de Jésus*, III, col. 720).
- 13. KENNETH (or FRANCIS XAVIER) STRACHAN. 22nd November 1717 to September 1721. Son of Sir James Strachan, baronet of Thornton in The Mearns (a Protestant), and Catherine Ross of Pittendriech (Midlothian); to Scots College, Douai, 4th July 1700; joined Society of Jesus in Bavaria (or in Tournai, 17th September 1703?); taught Philosophy; from Douai to Madrid, 13th June 1717; rector in Madrid, as above; a master in the college and confessor to Countess of Castelblanco in Madrid until 23rd December 1724; returned to Douai from Madrid, 1725, to be procurator and minister; rector of Scots College, Douai, 1731 to 1736; procurator of Scottish mission at Paris, 1736. (Cf. Foley, ed., Records of the English Province of the Society of Jesus, VIII, p. 743).
- 14. WILLIAM CLERK. October 1721 to September 1726. Born in Edinburgh, c. 1669, the son of William Clerk (an advocate) and Jean Cars; to Scots College, Douai, 18th September 1688; joined Society of Jesus, 1689, and professed at Loreto, 2nd February 1706; rector of Scots College, Rome, 24th November 1712 to 16th June 1721; rector at Madrid, as above;

- confessor to Philip V, from March (or September) 1726 until his (Clerk's) death, in San Ildefonso de la Granja, 19th August 1743; buried in Jesuit College, Segovia.
- 15. WILLIAM MacGILL. September 1726 to 11th October 1734. Arrived in Madrid from Lyons, c. November 1717; rector at Madrid, as above; probably remained in College until end of October 1734; probably in Madrid in the summers of 1735, 1736 and 1737; between July 1742 and March 1745, returned to Madrid and, a month after his arrival, died there.

- 16. GABRIEL BOUSEMART. November 1734 to October 1741. (Provincial of Toledo, 1744-45.)

- JOHN SETON. 1632 to 1637 and 25th September 1652 to 10th April 1654. The son of Chamberlain of Fyvie; studied and taught Philosophy in La Flèche, France; sent to Scots College, Douai, 1st August 1625; entered Society of Jesus novitiate at Tournai, 1625; left Madrid for Scotland, 17th February 1637; prefect of studies (?) at Douai, c. 1644.49; short secret visits to Scotland to enlist support for Montrose, 1649-50; died in Colegio Imperial, Madrid, 10th April 1654.
- 2. JOHN HAY. c. 1645-48 see Madrid Students' List, no. 5.
- 3. GEORGE IGNATIUS BLACKHALL ("BRACAL"). 1655 to 1656. Brother of Charles Blackball, missionary in Scotland; had been a merchant in Spain before entering Society of Jesus as a lay brother; came from Soria as assistant to Adam Gordon, rector-administrator of the College, July 1655; to Jesuit house at Arévalo, near Avila, 1656.
- 4. ROBERT GRANT. 1656 (or earlier) to 1657. Born in Yorkshire, 1594; entered Society of Jesus novitiate, 1618; prefect of studies at St.-Omer; in Alcalá de Henares, 1656. (Cf. Sommervogel, op. cit., III, col. 1680 same person?)
- 5. JAMES SEMPLE c. 1660-70. See Madrid Students' List, no. 24.

- 6. ALEXANDER SINCLAIR (or SCOTT). 1677 to 1679 see Madrid Students' List, no. 20.
- 7. JOHN GORDON? To c. 1685. Born c. 1640 (1638?), the son of Adam Gordon of Artloch and Isabel Leslie, the sister of Fr. George Leslie; to Scots College, Douai, 25th April 1655; joined Society of Jesus at Tournai, 1660/62; taught Humanities/Philosophy in Douai, 1672 (for fourteen years); was said, in 1707, to have been a missionary in Scotland for thirty years; died in Aberdeen, October 1720. (Cf. Foley, op. cit., VII, p. 309).
- 8. JAMES CUNNINGHAM. 1695.
- 9. BURNETT. 1717 to ? See Madrid Students' List, no. 40.
- 10. JOHN SETON 1723. See Madrid Students' List, no. 45.
- 11. JOHN RIDDOCH. 1723 to 1726. Born 11th (or 22nd) September 1700; to Scots College, Douai, July 1714; joined Society of Jesus at Nancy, 24th September 1718; taught Grammar, studied Philosophy (in Champagne ?); taught Humanities in College in Madrid (not yet ordained), c. December 1723 to mid-1726; taught in various places in France, 1726 to 1729; studied Theology at Rheims, 1729 to 1732, and taught Philosophy at Auxerre, 1732 to 1734; to Scottish mission, 8th March 1736; rector of Scots College, Douai, 27th August 1743 to January 1748 and 17th January 1757 to May 1766.
- 12. WILLIAM —. In College as master, January 1724.
- 13. ALEXANDER GRANT. 1726 to 11th October 1734. Came from Douai to replace Fr. Francis Xavier Strachan.
- 14. KENNETH McKENZIE. September 1729 to 1732 (?) See Madrid Students' List, no. 58.
- 15. JAMES GORDON. 1730. Born 16 September 1702, the son of John Gordon of Auchleuchries and Elizabeth Grant of Crichy; to Scots College, Douai, 15th July 1717; entered Society of Jesus, Roman novitiate, August 1719; taught Humanities in the Roman province for four years; arrived in Madrid, 1730, and taught Humanities in the College for one year; studied Theology in Rome and, in 1735, returned to Douai; rector of Scots College, Douai, 31st August 1739 to August 1743 (?).
- 16. JOHN DUNBAR. 1730. See Madrid Students' List, no. 50.
- 17. ALOYSIUS McGUIRE left College, 10th August (?) 1733.
- 18. LUIS DE BEAUMONT. 1st October 1733 to 10th October 1734. A non-Jesuit teacher in the College.
- 19. FRANCISCO FER ("L'ABBE"). 1st October 1733 to 10th October 1734. A non-Jesuit teacher in the College.

- THOMAS BROWN (or BAILIE). Son of John Brown of Lochhill in the parish of New Abbey, Galloway, and Jean Johnston of Newby; to Scots College, Douai, 7th December 1627 (Syntax); to Scots College, Madrid, November 1632; joined Society of Jesus, Seville, 1634; died in novitiate in great sanctity, 24th March 163....
- 2. FREDERICK MAXWELL (or ESCOTO). Born c. 1615, the son of Baron Herries of Terregles; to Scots College, Douai, 28th July 1629 (Grammar) one of the students maintained by Col. Semple; to Scots College, Madrid, November 1632; entered Society of Jesus, Villagarcía (near Valladolid), 1634; was in College, 1648 to 1649/50, then in Scotland (until perhaps 1653); rector of the College, 18th February 1656 until his death in Madrid, December 1659. (Cf. Sommervogel, op. cit., VII, col. 970; Foley, op. cit., VII, p. 496).
- 3. JOHN PATERSON. From Kinharvie in the parish of New Abbey, Galloway; to Scots College, Douai, 7th December 1627 (Syntax); to Scots College, Madrid, November 1632 (after Philosophy); went to Alcalá de Henares to study; entered Society of Jesus but, soon after entering (?), died.

1633

- 4. ALEXANDER GORDON. In College at start of 1633 but left, 1634.
- 5. JOHN HAY. In College from start of 1633; also there as a priest, c. 1645-48.
- 6. JOHN IRVINE. In College from start of 1633 but left, 1634.
- 7. ALEXANDER SCRIMGEOUR (or SKINNER or SCHEMERS?). Born in Edinburgh, 1621; arrived in College, 26th February 1633 (?), from San Sebastián; left for Scots College, Douai, 10th September 1636; sent to Scots College, Rome, 1640, and entered Society of Jesus there, 24th March (or May) 1641; worked as missionary in Scotland and England; at Loreto as penitentiary; died, either on 3rd September 1679 (at Loreto?) or at Douai on 23rd September 1679, two months after fleeing from persecution in England. (Cf. Foley, op. cit., VIII, pp. 693 and 880).

- 8. GEORGE ANDERSON. Born at Tulloch in Cromarty (or Ross?), c. 1617, the son of George Anderson (chamberlain of the Marquis of Huntly) and Margaret Hall; to Scots College, Douai, 13th July 1641 (Humanities); to Scots College, Madrid, 1643, and, later, to Rome; joined Society of Jesus, but dismissed.
- 9. WILLIAM LAING. Born at Aberdeen, c. 1625, the son of William Laing and Elizabeth Anderson; to Scots College, Douai, 1638, but dismissed because of ill health; re-admitted (Grammar), 1st October 1642, but again dismissed, 1643, because of ineptitude at studies;

perhaps a student in the Scots College, Madrid; drowned in "comitatus" of Marquis of Castel Rodrigo (Governor General of the Netherlands), 1649.

- 10. THOMAS JOHNSTON. Born at Aberdeen, c. 1618, the son of Robert and Agnes Johnston; to Scots College, Madrid, 7th September 1647; ordained a priest and, on 22nd November 1649, left for Scotland; entered Scots Benedictine Monastery, Ratisbon, professed on 6th May 1655 ("Fr. Ninian"), and died there, 17th December 1663.
- 11. HUGH ROSS. Born in parish of Coul in the district of Mar, c. 1627, the son of Alexander Ross and Mary Bonner; regent at the University of Aberdeen; convert to Catholicism; to Scots College, Madrid, 7th September 1647, but left, 15th January 1648.
- 12. WILLIAM SEMPLE. The son of John and Mary Semple; regent of philosophy in University of Glasgow for several years; convert from Calvinism; to Scots College, Madrid, 7th September 1647, and died, 13th December 1647.
- 13. ANDREW YOUNGSON (or YOUNG or JUNIO). Born at Dores in the parish of Kettins, Angus, 13th July 1619, the son of Alexander Young and Elizabeth Reid; regent of philosophy in University of Aberdeen and Marischal College, Aberdeen, 1645- 46; convert to Catholicism and left Scotland on pretext of studying medicine; to Scots College, Madrid, 7th September 1647; entered Society of Jesus, 20th November 1647, and was at novitiate in Badajoz in 1649; was administrator of College, September 1654 to April 1655; professor at University of Alcalá for seventeen years and taught Theology at Toledo, Villareal, Murcia and Madrid; died in Madrid, 1st August 1679. (Cf. Sommervogel, op. cit., IV, col. 886).
- 14. ROBERT GORDON. Born at Elgin, c. 1623, the son of George Gordon and Margaret Bonneyman; arrived at Scots College, Madrid, 2nd November 1647, having completed Grammar, but not accepted because ignorant of Latin and had a lead pellet in his head; became a captain in the army.
- 15. ROBERT MAXWELL. Born c. 1628, the son of James Maxwell and Alice Collins, and nephew of Lord Herries; to Scots College, Madrid, 2nd November 1647, but dismissed, 10th April 1648.
- 16. JOHN REID (or READE). Born in London, c. 1629, the son of John Reid ("Domini Tribuni militum") of Aikenhead and Judith Wekman; to Scots College, Madrid, 2nd November 1647 (having completed Syntax), but dismissed, 22nd November 1649.
- 17. EDWARD REID (or READE). Born in London, c. 1630, the younger brother of no. 16; to Scots College, Madrid, 2nd November 1647 (having completed Syntax), but dismissed, 22nd November 1649.
- 18. ARTHUR FORBES. Born c. 1631, the son of James Forbes of Blackton, Aberdeenshire, and Margaret (or Magdalene) Fraser of Philorth, daughter of Baron of Philorth; to Scots College, Douai, 10th September 1643 (Figures); to Scots College, Madrid, 10th November 1647 (having completed Syntax); intelligent but obstinate, insisted on enlisting in army, and left College, 10th April 1648; at Scots College, Rome, 12th February 1650 to 3rd February 1651;

- having returned to Scotland, married in 1671, and became Laird of Balvenie, Banffshire; died, 1695.
- 19. JOHN MENZIES. Born in Aberdeen (parish of St. Machar), c. 1627, the son of Thomas Menzies of Balgownie and Margaret Gordon of Grandholm; to Scots College, Douai, 16th November 1643 (Grammar); at Scots College, Paris, for two years, then dismissed for ineptitude; to Scots College, Madrid, 10th November 1647 (having completed Rhetoric), but left, 15th January 1648, because inept at studies; became a Canon of St. Genevieve in Paris, 1649.
- 20. ALEXANDER SINCLAIR (or SCOTT). Born in Aberdeen (parish of St. Machar), c. 1627 (15th September 1632?), the son of Walter Sinclair and Mariota (or Mariora) Douglas; converted to Catholicism; to Scots College, Douai, 17th January (or 19th February) 1645 (Poetry); to Scots College, Madrid, 10th November 1647 (having completed Rhetoric); left, 1649 or 30th May 1650 (being perhaps at Alcalá, 1649-50); at Scots College, Rome, November 1650 to 1654; returned to Spain for reasons of health, 1654; joined Society of Jesus, entered novitiate at Plasencia, 1656 (or 10th April 1655), transferred to Alcalá, February 1657; "sang Mass" in Scots College, Madrid, Easter 1659; professor of Rhetoric, Colegio Imperial, Madrid, for eight years; professor of Philosophy and Belles Lettres, Scots College, Madrid, c. 1677-79 (for five years?); author of *Principum feminarum exemplar, id est, vita Sanctae Margaritae, Scotorum Reginae* (Madrid, 1679) and of verse-play on life of Sr. Hermenegild, martyr, performed by his pupils in Rhetoric, 18th October 1668; died in Madrid, 20th/22nd April 1679. (Cf. Sommervogel, op. cit., VII, col. 966).

- 21. ROBERT BARCLAY. Born at Irvine, the elder son of Hugh Barclay and Mary Maxwell, and a nephew of Fr. Hugh Semple; to Scots College, Madrid, 17th January 1648, and left, 22nd November 1649; to Scots College, Douai, 13th February 1650 (Syntax) and left, 16/26th August 1631; to Scots College, Rome (Logic), and left, 24th April 1652; joined Society of Jesus.
- 22. JOHN FORBES. Born at Aberdeen, 24th August 1626, the third son of Duncan Forbes of Camphill (or Campbell) and Elizabeth Forbes of Corse, (both Protestants); to Scots College, Douai, 10th March 1644 (Syntax); to Scots College, Madrid, 17th January 1648, and left, 10th April 1648; in Scotland, married Jean Forbes, daughter of John Forbes, minister of Kincardine O'Neill, and gave up faith; in 1671 was a magistrate and showed friendship towards Jesuits and other Cath lics.
- 23. ROBERT FRANCIS IRVINE (or IRWIN). Born at Aberdeen, 1629, the son of Alexander Irvine and Mary Menzies (who, when in Scotland, had given refuge to Jesuits in their house, but who had been in exile abroad for sixteen years); to Scots College, Douai, 17th December 1640, and left for Madrid, 12/17th September 1647; to Scots College, Madrid, 1648, and left for Rome, 22nd November 1649, where, at Scots College, studied Logic but left, 21st June 1650; (in Rome Register, called Alexander, the name of his younger brother; had also been at Scots College, Paris, but dismissed.) (Cf. *The Innes Review*, vol. V (1954), p. 69). Also mentioned in 'Annals of the Scots College".

- 23a. JOHN IRWIN. Arrived from San Sebastián; still in College, 1649;
- 23b. N. FORBES. In College, 1649;
- 23c. N. FINTAN. Given a breviary, 1648; (Maestre Fontana given viático, 1649)
- 23d. EDWARD RISLEO (RISLEY). Left College, 22nd November (or December) 1649.

24. JAMES SEMPLE. Born 1st May 1638, the son of Lord Hugh Semple and Elizabeth Hay, daughter of Earl of Errol; a nephew of Colonel William Semple; to Scots College, Douai, 1649 (Figures); to Scots College, Madrid, 18th February 1656; joined Society of Jesus, 14th May 1656, and went to novitiate of Huete, near Cuenca; taught Rhetoric in College for eight years, c. 1660-70; was in Scotland for seventeen years; returned to Province of Toledo and died in Madrid (after 1693?).

25/26. Two students (names unknown) arrived from Paris, 12th December 1656; (not no. 28).

1657

- 27. JOSEPH BELLO (BELL?). In Scots College, Madrid, 1657, and left for Paris, September 1657.
- 28. JOHN MOORE (or MURO). In Scots College, Madrid, 1657, and left for Jesús del Monte to study Arts (or for Paris), June 1657.

1658

A student arrived "again" in May 1658; two left for Paris; probably two students in College thereafter.

William Grant, Administrator, 1659-65

- 29. EDWARD BROWN (or FOUNTAIN). Born c. 1642, the son of and Jean Brown; to Scot s College, Douai, 20th October 1657 (Grammar); to Scots College, Madrid, 27th February 1660, but probably gone by end of 1663.
- 30. ALEXANDER IRVINE. Born c. 1640, the son of Alexander Irvine of Belty and Isabel Irvine; to Scots College, Douai, 18th October 1656 (Grammar); to Scots College, Madrid, 27th February 1660; at Scots College, Paris, c. 1662-67; thereafter to Scotland as a missionary; died, 7th September 1706, "at Traquair where he mostly resided". (*Scotichronicon*, p. 630).

31. MICHAEL MENZIES. Born c. 1641, the son of Thomas Menzies of Balgownie and Margaret Gordon of Abergeldie; to Scots College, Douai, 13th June 1655 (Figures); to Scots College, Madrid, 27th February 1660; went to Paris and became an Augustinian.

1664

- 32. CHARLES FOUNTAIN (PINTAN? FONCANO?) (Charles Foncanot) Born in Edinburgh c. 1615; to Scots College, Douai, 8th October 1632; returned to Scotland and, in 1640, was a teacher in England; became a priest in Spain) To Scots College, Madrid, 1st October 1664; ordained a priest and left for Scotland, 1665, but remained there only eight months; was in Paris by 1667 and died there, 6th October 1683.
- 33. GEORGE INNES (Sir). The son of Col. James Innes and Maxwell; to Scots College, Douai, 27th June 1659; to Scots College, Madrid, at own request, 1st October 1664; ordained a priest in Madrid, 1673; returned to Scotland and worked there for twenty-five years (being once captured, but held only for a short time); became Baronet of Denoon and Balvenie; died, 26th February 1698.
- 34. THOMAS MAXWEL. Born in Nithsdale; to Scots College, Douai, 8th July 1662; to Scots College, Madrid, at his own request, 1st October 1664; joined army, 1671, and served in Ireland, France and Italy; fatally wounded, leading a cavalry brigade at the battle of Marsaglia, 1693.
- 35. JOHN STRACHAN. The son of Strachan and Hay of Delgaty; to Scots College, Douai, 20th October 1662 (Grammar); to Scots College, Madrid, at his own request, 1st October 1664.

- 36. JOHN FALCONER. Nephew of Fr. William Grant, former administrator of the College; from Douai to Madrid, 3rd October 1669, already a Jesuit novice.
- 37. GEORGE GORDON. Born c. 1654, the son of Adam Gordon of Artloch and Isabel Leslie, and a nephew of Fr. George Leslie of New Leslie; to Scots College, Douai, August / September 1669; to Scots College, Madrid, 3rd October 1669; returned to Douai, 23rd December 1673, and to Scotland, unordained, 20th June (?) 1674. (Three brothers Jesuit priests: John, James, Peter).
- 38. JAMES SEMPLE. Born c. 1655, the son of Lord Semple; to Scots College, Douai, 29th April 1665 (Figures); to Scots College, Madrid, at his father's request, 3rd October 1669; died in Madrid.

38a. JOHN REID. Though not a seminarian, sent by his father, John Reid of Barbados (and probably a cousin of Fr. Alexander Sinclair, student no. 20) to College; probably left in 1679.

1678

38b ALEXANDER BUCHAN. Probably not a student of College; born near Aberdeen, 1659; joined Society of Jesus at Madrid, 1678, and later was at Douai; as a priest, left Madrid for Scotland, 1694/95; a missionary in Scotland, c. 1698; died in Aberdeen, 15th August 1718. 40. ALEXANDER BURNETT. Perhaps not a student of College; born c. 1671, the son of the Protestant minister of Rayne; to Scots College, Douai, 1st October 1699, where completed Theology; entered Society of Jesus in Madrid. (A Fr. Burnett resided in the College, 1717-18).

- 41. JAMES BELL. Perhaps not a student of College; born c. 1696; to Scots College, Douai, 6th November 1707; fled to Madrid, 6/8th February 1710; joined Augustinian Recollects in Madrid.
- 42. GEORGE SINCLAIR. Perhaps not a student of College; born c. 1697; to Scots College, Douai, 6th November 1707; fled to Madrid, 6/8th February 1710; joined Augustinian Recollects in Madrid.

Thomas Fife, Rector, 1714-17

- 43. WILLIAM GORDON. The son of Francis Gordon of Craig; to Scots College, Douai, May 1715; to Scots College, Madrid, 1715 (with nos. 44 and 45); joined Society of Jesus, Seville novitiate, c. October 1717.
- 44. JOHN IGNATIUS ODIE (or EDIE or ADE). Born 1699; to Scots College, Douai, 13th May 1713; to Scots College, Madrid, 1715 (with nos. 43 and 45); joined Society of Jesus, Tarragona novitiate, c. October 1717; studied Theology in Valencia and, by February 1726, ordained a priest; was in Aragón Province, 1732.

- 45. JOHN SETON. Born 9th November 1695, the son of Sir George Seton of Garleton and Jean Seton; to Scots College, Douai, 24th October 1708; to Stots College, Madrid, 1715 (with nos. 43 and 44); joined Society of Jesus, 20th September 1716; after simple vows, taught Humanities for three years at Villareal and studied Theology for four years at Alcalá; was a priest and resident in the College, 1723; went to Scotland as a missionary, July 1725; instructed and received into the Church George (later Bishop) Hay, 21st December 1748; died in Edinburgh, 16th July 1757.
- 46. ANDREW SETON. Born c. 1698, the younger brother of no. 45; to Scots College, Douai, July 1714; to Scots College, Madrid, 1715 (or 1718); joined army.

1716

- 47. JOHN (FRANCIS XAVIER) HUNTER (or CLARK). Born in London, 1694; converted to Catholicism in Spain, c. 1716; a student in the College, 1st May 1716 until 25th April 1717; to English College, Madrid, then (11th May 1717) to Jesuit College, Ocaña, (where he caused a great deal of trouble) and finally (c. 20th October 1717) to English College, Valladolid, which he left, May 1718. (Cf. *The English College at Madrid, pp. 162, 345-350; Registers of the English College at Valladolid*, p. 182).
- 48. HUGH SEMPLE (or SEMPIL). Born 1701, the son of Robert Semple of Glassford and Elizabeth Abercromby; to Scots College, Douai, December 1715; to Scots College, Madrid, between 1716 and 1718; joined Society of Jesus, at Villagarcía, autumn 1718; a priest of the English Province and minister of the English Province at Watten (Flanders); left the Society of Jesus, 16th June 1730. (Cf. Foley, op. cit., VIII, p. 698).
- 49. GEORGE SEMPLE (or SEMPIL). Brother of no. 48; to Scots College, Douai, December 1715; to Scots College, Madrid, between 1716 and 1718; joined Society of Jesus, at Madrid, 28th June 1718; left the Society, 1722.

Kenneth (Francis Xavier) Strachan, Rector, 1717-21

- 50. JOHN DUNBAR. A student in the Scots College, Madrid, November 1717 (or earlier) to December 1721 (or later); joined Society of Jesus, Madrid novitiate, 9th October 1722; was at Oropesa, 1726; was teaching in the College, 1730; went to Scotland (from Murcia), 1732, and perhaps missionary in Glengairn, 1732-34; was ill in Colegio Imperial, Madrid, c. 1750; probably still in Madrid, 1758.
- 51. JOHN TROTTAR. Perhaps not a student of College; born in Edinburgh, 18th August 1701/04; joined Society of Jesus, Madrid, 19th September 1722; returned to Scotland, 29th May 1733, and was a priest at Aberdeen, 1740. (Is he to be identified with no. 50?).

1718

(51 a). JOHN KELLIE (or KELLEY). Son of Florence Kellie (or Kelley), was a fee-paying student of the College in 1718 and left, 7th September 1722.

52. JAMES MacDONALD (or MacDONEL). To Scots College, Madrid, 19th June 1720; left, 5th April 1725, and went to Barcelona.

1721

53. JOHN BAPTIST HIGGINS (or HEGGINS). Son of John Higgins, an Irishman and Charles V's physician, and — —, of Bayonne; to Scots College, Madrid, as fee-paying student, 23rd June 1721; left for Douai with Fr. Strachan (ex-rector), 23rd December 1724, and arrived at Scots College there, 16th March 1725; returned to Spain, c. 1728.

- 54. ROBERT BROWN. The son of Robert Brown of Millhead and Elizabeth Maxwell; to Scots College, Douai, 19th November 1721; to Scots College, Madrid, June 1722 (via Bilbao); returned to Scotland, unordained, 1724/25.
- 55. JAMES COLGRAVE. The son of Sir George Colgrave; arrived at Scots College, Madrid, c. June 1722; left for La Flèche, France, 1st October 1727.
- 56. WILLIAM LINDSAY. The son of Alexander Lindsay and Herries; to Scots College, Douai, 19th November 1721; to Scots College, Madrid, June 1722; left for Cádiz, 1st October 1728, and returned to Scotland.
- 57. ROBERT GRANT. The son of John Grant; to Scots College, Madrid, July 1722; although wanted to join Society of Jesus, left for Scotland in obedience to father's wishes, 6th April 1726.
- 58. KENNETH McKENZIE. Born 1714, the son of Hector and Jean McKenzie; to Scots College, Douai, 20th May 1722; left for Scots College, Madrid (via Bilbao), 21st July 1722; joined Society of Jesus, Madrid novitiate, 30th April 1724; from Murcia to Scots College, Madrid, as a brother, September 1729 and taught there; to Paris, 1732, where he was ordained a priest; to Scotland as a missionary, 1753, being in Strathglass, 1756-75, (and at Braemar, 1764); died at Aberdeen, 30th April 1775. (Cf. Foley, op. cit., VII, p. 472: born 4th May 1704; to Edinburgh, 19th February 1737, then at Kirkconnel; died at Munches, 14th November 1744).

58a. JOHN O'BRYAN (or O'BRYEN). Son of Da. Aleja Oconer (Alice O'Connor?), a fee-paying student of the College; arrived, 18th October 1723, and left, 15th October 1724 (or later).

1724

59. LUDOVICUS DELVALL. Born c. 1708, the son of Ludovico Marchione; member of the Order of the Knights of Malta; to Scots College, Douai, 8th November 1722 (Rhetoric); to Scots College, Madrid, 1724; miraculously cured after prayer to St. Francis Xavier and so, in fulfilment of a vow, joined Society of Jesus; went to Paraguay

60. ANDREW COLGRAVE. Born 1716/17, the younger brother of no. 55; arrived at Scots College, Madrid, 31st May 1724 (via San Sebastián and Valladolid); left, 10th August 1733.

1725

- 61. ROBERT HERRIES (or HARRIS). The son of John Herries of Auchencheen, near Moniaive in Galloway, and Elizabeth Gordon; to Scots College, Douai, 2nd October 1724; to Scots College, Madrid (via Cádiz), early 1725 (with no. 62); left, sometime after April 1725; practised medicine in Scotland.
- 62. ERNEST LESLIE. Born 5th February 1713, the son of Charles Leslie and Elizabeth Fordyce; to Scots College, Douai, 2nd October 1724; to Scots College, Madrid (via Cádiz), early 1725 (Humanities); left for Nancy, October 1728, and joined Society of Jesus, 28th November 1728; nominated rector of the Scots College, Madrid, 1734, but appointment cancelled; taught for many years in France, author of poems in French and Fellow of Royal Academy of Sciences at Nancy (where he was living, 1767). (Cf. Foley, op. cit., VII, p. 453).

1726

- 63. JOSEPH DUGUID (DUGUD). Born 6th January 1713, the son of Robert Duguid of Auchenhove and Teresa Leslie of Balquhain; to Scots College, Douai, 29th November 1723 (Grammar), one of four brothers there; to Scots College, Madrid, August 1726 (where completed Humanities); joined Society of Jesus in Rome, 1730/31 (or 20th January 1733), and studied Philosophy there; later, in Madrid again; returned to Douai, August 1735 or December 1736; arrived in Edinburgh, 20th June 1742, was professed there, 24th March 1747, and was working there, 1764; died in Edinburgh, 28th February 1775. (Cf. Foley, op. cit., VII, p. 214; *The Innes Review*, vol. XV (1964), p. 141).
- 64. JAMES HAY. To Scots College, Madrid, from Douai, August 1726 (with no. 63); joined Society of Jesus, c. September 1729; left Province of Toledo for Douai, December 1736.

65. ALLAN MacDONALD ("Don Alano"). Perhaps not a student of College; born in Western Isles, c. 1696; at Scots College, Rome, 1715 to 1721; arrived in Madrid, 1727/28, and left for Douai, 1st July 1728; ordained a priest in Scotland between 1736 and 1743; accompanied Bonnie Prince Charlie while in Britain, 1745-46, as his confessor and as chaplain to Clanranald men; imprisoned on a ship in the Thames, then at Tilbury and in Southwark New Gaol, and later banished; was in Paris and, from 1747, in Rome; returned to Scotland, 1765/68, and worked in Traquair for a time; for last years of his life, lived in retirement in Edinburgh, where he died, 17th May 1781. (Cf. *The Innes Review*, vol. XV (1964), p. 142; vol. XVII (1966), p. 140).

c. 1730

66. JAMES THOMSON. Born at Aberdeen, the son of Thomas Thomson and Lucy (or Louise) Shand; to Scots College, Douai, 10th September 1729; arrived at Scots College, Madrid, summer 1730; left Madrid, 11th October 1734; arrived at Scots College, Douai, 5th December 1734 (Poetry); after Philosophy, joined Society of Jesus and went to novitiate in Landberg (Bavaria?), September 1738.

- 67. FLORENCE O'DONNOGHUE. The son of Florence O'Donnoghue of Ireland and Anne Urquhart of Meldrum; arrived at Scots College, Madrid, c. November 1730; left Madrid, 11th October 1734; arrived at Scots College, Douai, 5th December 1734 (Poetry); after completing Logic, joined the army.
- 68. JAMES (EDWARD) DALZELL. Born c. 1717, the son of Colonel John Daizell, brother of Lord Carnwath; to Scots College, Madrid (date of arrival unknown); left Madrid, 11th October 1734; arrived at Scots College, Douai, 5th December 1734 (Syntax); later, joined the army.
- 69. CHARLES FARQUHARSON. Born c. 1713, the son of Lewis Farquharson of Auchindryne, near Braemar, and Margaret Farquhar son; a brother of Fr. John Farquharson, Jesuit; to Scots College, Madrid (date of arrival unknown); left Madrid, 11th October 1734; arrived at Scots College, Douai, 5th December 1734 (Poetry ?); after Philosophy, joined Society of Jesus and went to novitiate of Landberg (Bavaria ?), 23rd September 1738; went to Scotland as missionary, 1745, taken as prisoner to London, 1746, and banished to Holland; returned to Scotland, 1749, and was working in Glengairn, 1764; went to Braemar, 1781, and died there, at Arderg, 30th November 1799
- 70. JOHN FRASER. The son of John Fraser of Strathglass and Margaret Fraser; to Scots College, Madrid (date of arrival unknown); left Madrid, 11th October 1734; arrived at Scots College, Douai, 5th December 1734 (Poetry); after Philosophy, joined Society of Jesus at Bordeaux, 1738; died at Parton (Galloway), 12th March 1797.
- 71. JOHN (JAMES ?) HERRIES (commonly GORDON). Born c. 1716, the son of John Herries of Auchencheen, near Moniaive in Galloway, and Elizabeth Gordon; a brother of no. 61; to Scots College, Douai, 12th August 1731; to Scots College, Madrid (date of arrival unknown); after a short time, left Madrid, 11th October 1734; returned to Scots College, Douai, 5th December 1734 (Grammar); later, joined the army and became a lieutenant.

The foregoing Register (rectors, priests and students during the Madrid period) is based on the publication of the New Spalding Club, *Records of the Scots Colleges*, (Aberdeen, 1906) and especially on the Madrid and Douai sections. The many amendments and additions in the present Register, however, are derived mainly from the following sources:

- (e) scraps of information scattered through the various Account and Administration Books of the Madrid period and now forming part of the College archives. Many of the biographical data are now unverifiable and their certainty cannot be guaranteed. This applies to some of the material in the

foregoing Register, although statements that are improbable have been excluded or marked by signs of interrogation.

* In the administration book covering the period 1633-60 (College archives A/i), the contents page (in Hugh Semple's hand) promises Alumnorum nomina parentes et dies receptionis et studia: f. 241", but all of the folios after f. 194 are missing. The data for the Madrid section of Records of the Scots Colleges were provided in 1905 by Rev. James Humble, then vice- rector of the college. He probably copied from the appendix to G. A. Griffin's manuscript *Historical Notice of the Scottish College at Madrid and Valladolid* (College archives 54/15, but at present in Columba House), the author of which may have had access to the missing folios, which are no doubt the original Madrid register, added to by Hugh Semple's successors.

Valladolid Period, from 1770

The Register of rectors, priests and students at Valladolid is based on the lists in the college (Archives 54/4 and A/79), part of which is published in *Records of the Scots Colleges*, pp. 204- 245 (Aberdeen, New Spalding Club, 1906). The information contained there has been augmented and, in some cases, corrected, from various other sources, mainly correspondence to and from the college and The Catholic Directories for Scotland.

RECTORS

- 1. JOHN GEDDES. 31st May 1771 to 1st November 1780. Born at Corridoun in the Enzie, 29th August 1735 (O.S.), the son of John Geddes and Marjory Burgess; arrived at Scots College, Rome, 30th January 1750; ordained a priest (for Lowland District) by Cardinal Spinelli in Rome, 18th March 1759; in the Cabrach, October 1759 to September 1762; superior at Scalan, September 1762 to December 1767; at Preshome, December 1767 to February 1770; rector of the college; nominated Titular Bishop of Morocco and coadjutor vicar apostolic of the Lowland District, 30th September 1779, and consecrated by Archbishop Lorenzana of Toledo, in Madrid, 30th November 1780; arrived in Scotland, May 1781, and had his residence in Edinburgh (1781-93), Scalan (1793) and Aberdeen (1793-99), where he died, 11th February 1799.
- 2. ALEXANDER CAMERON. 1st November 1780 (official appointment 16th January 1781) to 1798. Born at Auchindryne, near Braemar, 28th July 1747 (O.S.), the son of James Cameron and Marjory (or Helen) McIntosh; at Scalan seminary, 1760 to 4th August 1764; arrived at Scots College, Rome, 23rd December 1764; ordained a priest (for Lowland District) in Rome, 2nd February 1772; in Strathavon, 1772-80; rector of the college; nominated Titular Bishop of Maximianopolis and coadjutor vicar apostolic of the Lowland District, 19th September 1797, and consecrated in Madrid by Bishop de Tavira of Salamanca, 28th October 1798; arrived in Scotland, 22nd August 1802; became vicar apostolic of the Lowland District, 24th August 1805; died in Edinburgh, 7th February 1828.
- 3. JOHN GORDON. 1798 (official appointment 27th January 1799) to 15th February 1810. Born at Clashnore in Glenlivet, 18th May 1747, the son of John Gordon and Jean Nairn, and

nephew of Abbé Peter Grant; at Scalan seminary, c. 1760 to 4th August 1764; arrived at Scots College, Rome, 23rd December 1764; ordained a priest (for Lowland District) by Cardinal Marcantonio Colonna in Lateran Basilica, Rome, 5th June 1773; in Aberdeen, 1774-76; arrived in Valladolid, as vice-rector, 22nd August 1776; rector of the college; died at Montréjeau, Hte.-Garonne, 15th February 1810.

- 4. ALEXANDER CAMERON. 15th February 1810 (official appointment 24th May 1816) to 20th September 1833. See Valladolid Students' List, no. 30
- 5. JOHN CAMERON. 20th September 1833 (official appointment 25th June 1867) to 1st November 1873. Born at Tamenturn in Glengairn, 20th February 1791; at Aquhorties seminary, 2nd November 1803 to 1813/14; ordained a priest (for Lowland District) by Bishop Cameron at Aquhorties, 16th October 1814; taught at Aquhorties until sent to Spain, 1816; arrived in Valladolid as vice-rector, 12th December 1816; rector of the college; lived in retirement in college, 1st November 1873, until his death there, 15th February 1876.
- 6. JOHN COWIE. 1st November 1873 (official appointment 13th September 1876) to 25th March 1879. Born at Fochabers, 14th February 1809; at Aquhorties seminary, 25th November 1821 to 1828, and at St.-Sulpice, July 1828 to July 1833; ordained a priest (for the Eastern District) by Bishop Carruthers in Edinburgh, 7th September 1833; at Dalbeattie, 1833-35; vice-rector of Scots College, Rome, 1835-41; on teaching staff at Blairs, 1841-43; arrived in Valladolid as vice-rector, 29th September 1843; rector of the college; died in the college, 25th March 1879.
- 7. DAVID McDONALD. 25th March 1879 (official appointment 23rd June 1879) to 17th January 1903. Born in Fort William, 16th March 1832; at Scots Benedictine abbey, Ratisbon, as student, September 1841 to 1845; to Blairs, 26th January 1846, and to College of Propaganda Fide, Rome, 29th August 1850; ordained a priest (for the Western District) in Rome, 9th March 1856; on teaching staff at Blairs, 30th July 1856 to summer of 1865; arrived in Valladolid as professor, 27th September 1865, and became vice-rector, 1st November 1873; rector of the college; lived in retirement in college, 12th October 1903, until his death there, 19th September 1909.
- 8. JOHN WOODS. 12th October 1903 (official appointment 9th June 1903) to 14th April 1909. See Valladolid Students' List, no. 194.
- 9. JAMES HUMBLE. 14th April 1909 (official appointment 15th October 1909) until 23rd May 1940. See Valladolid Students' List, no. 232.
- 10. JAMES CONNOLLY. 23rd May 1940 (official appointment same date) to 30th June 1952. Born in Lumphinnans, Fife, 22nd December 1889, the son of —Connolly and— McEnaney; at Scots College, Rome, 1906-15, where ordained a priest (for Archdiocese of St. Andrews and Edinburgh) in Lateran Basilica, 1st November 1914, and gained doctorate in theology at Gregorian University; assistant priest at Inverkeithing, 1915-17, and priest in charge at Kelso and Jedburgh, 1917-19; arrived in Valladolid as vice-rector, 16th May 1919; rector of the college; left for Scotland, 22nd July 1952, and appointed to Rosewell, where he died, 26th June 1959.

- 11. PHILIP FLANAGAN. 1st July 1952 (official appointment 12th December 1952) to 22nd February 1960. Born in Baillieston, 2nd January 1913, the son of John Flanagan and Helen Owens; at St. Aloysius' College, Glasgow; to Scots College, Rome, 1929, where ordained a priest (for Archdiocese of Glasgow) by Cardinal Marchetti-Selvaggiani in Lateran Basilica, 21st December 1935, and gained a doctorate in theology at Gregorian University; vice-rector in Rome, 1938 to May 1940 and October 1946 to March 1952, and principal of philosophy at Blairs, September 1940 to June 1946; assigned to Diocese of Motherwell, 1948; rector of the college; rector of Scots College, Rome, February 1960 to June 1967; parish priest, Bellshill, July 1967.
- 12. DANIEL PATRICK BOYLE. 27th May 1960 (official appointment 15th December 1960) to 14th February 1965. Born at Loughanure, by Annagry, Donegal, 12th December 1917, the son of Neil Boyle and Mary Boyle; to Blairs, 1929, to St. Lo, 1934, and to St.-Sulpice, 1935; ordained a priest (for Archdiocese of St. Andrews and Edinburgh) by Archbishop McDonald, O.S.B., in Cathedral, Edinburgh, 14th September 1940; at University of Cambridge (St. Edmund's House), 1940-43, where graduated Bachelor of Arts; on teaching staff at Blairs, 1943-49 and 1952-60; in Valladolid as spiritual director, 7th September 1950 to 28th January 1952; rector of the college; rector of Blairs College, February 1965to June 1967; rector of Scots College, Rome, July 1967.
- 13. MAURICE TAYLOR. 2nd July 1965 (official appointment 22nd July 1965) to —. Born in Hamilton, 5th May 1926, the son of Maurice Taylor and Lucy McLaughlin; at St. Aloysius' College, Glasgow, and Our Lady's High School, Motherwell; philosophy course at Blairs, August 1942 to June 1944; on military service, August 1944 to August 1947; at Scots College, Rome, October 1947 to June 1951, and ordained a priest (for Diocese of Motherwell) by Mgr. Eliseus van de Weijar, O. Carm., tit. Bp. of Gor and Prelate *nullius* of Paracatú, Brazil, in College of St. Adalbert, Rome, 2nd July 1950; assistant priest, St. Bartholomew's, Coatbridge, 1951-52; doctorate course in theology, Gregorian University, Rome, 1952-54; assistant priest, St. Bernadette's, Motherwell, 1954-55; on teaching staff, St. Peter's College, Cardross, 1955-65; rector of the college.

OTHER PRIESTS IN THE COLLEGE, FROM 1770

- 1. JOHN BAPTIST GORDON. 11th December 1770 to 10th January 1774. born at Newmills, near Keith, the nephew of John Gordon, Principal of the Scots College, Paris; studied and received diaconate in Paris; ordained priest (for Lowland District) by Bishop of Valladolid, church of Santiago, Valladolid, 21st September 1771; taught humanities in the college; in Paris until summer, 1775, in the Cabrach, 1775-79, and in Paris again, 1779-81; in an Augustinian monastery, Flanders, 1781-84, and thereafter detained in a mental hospital.
- 2. ALLAN MacDONALD. 23rd February 1771 to 11th June 1776. Born in Morar, 1740/43, the nephew of Bishop Hugh MacDonald; student at Scots College, Rome, 13th March 1757 to 19th May 1767; priest of the Highland District; taught at Highland seminaries (Glenfinnan

- and Buorblach), 1767-71; vice-rector and master in the college; in Eigg (1776), Small Isles (1777-80), Barra (1780-85); taught at Samalaman, 1786, until his death, 22nd March 1788.

A. of Galia (?), in Paris, 17th December 1864; priest in charge, Banff (1865), Huntly (1869); master in the college and, from 25th March 1879, vice-rector; to Innerleithen and canon of the St. Andrews and Edinburgh chapter, 1890; chaplain, Ursuline convent, Edinburgh, 1898; died in Edinburgh, 12th December 1918.

Cork, 9th March 1840, the son of Michael McDermott and Catherine MacDonald; to Blairs (1853) and Scots College, Rome (1858), where ordained a priest (for Eastern District), 30th August 1863, and whence left for Scotland, 8th June 1865; on Blairs staff (1865-67), assistant at Dundee (1867-78) and priest in charge at Alloa (1878-80) and St. Mary's, Dundee (1880 until health broke, 1887); master in the college; chaplain, Little Sisters of the Poor, Lochee (1892-1902); canon of the Dunkeld chapter; retired to Alyth (1902) and to Musselburgh (1911), where died, 10th August 1922.

Born in Glasgow, 14th October 1915, the son of Robert McFaul and Anne Jane Connolly; at St. Mungo's Academy, Glasgow, Blairs (1929-33) and Bearsclen (1933-41); ordained a priest (Archdiocese of Glasgow) by Archbishop Mackintosh in Cathedral, Glasgow, 29th June 1941; spiritual director in the college.

STUDENTS

The order followed for this register of students at Valladolid is chronological, viz., according to date of arrival at the college. Within each group of those who arrived on the same day, the order found in *Records of the Scots Colleges* has been retained, since no other order less arbitrary could now be devised and any change would therefore be merely for the sake of change; but, from 1903 onwards, viz., that section of the register now being published for the first time, the order within each group is based, as far as possible, on dates of birth.

The spelling of surnames, especially those commencing with "Mac" or 'Mc", was, until comparatively recent times, notoriously inconsistent and variable. In this register, an attempt has been made to follow, as far as possible, the spelling adopted by the individuals themselves, especially when writing out the Mission Oath; in cases where this last is not extant, the form of spelling used is that most commonly found in the contemporary correspondence.

John Geddes, Rector, 1770-80

1770 [11th December]

Nos. 1 to 15 were given hospitality in the English College, Valladolid, from the time of their arrival until 31st May 1771.

- 1. HENRY OGILVY. Born at Corridoun in the Enzie; at Scalan; arrived in Valladolid from Scots College, Douai (1); left, un- ordained, October 1773; lived and worked in London and, later, in Madeira; great-great-grand father of Rt. Rev. George Bennett, Bishop of Aberdeen, 1918-46.
- 2. ADAM TYRIE. The son of David Tyrie of Dunnideer (near Insch) and Gordon; arrived in Valladolid from Scots College, Douai; left, unordained, 25th April 1776; lived and worked in London for some years; drowned off the coast of Portugal? or emigrated to Canada?
- 3. ALEXANDER MacDONALD (or MacDONELL). (Highland District) Born in Clianaig, Glen Spean, in December 1753, the son of Archibald MacDonald, Cadet of Keppoch; arrived in Valladolid from Scots College, Paris; ordained priest in Valladolid and returned to Scotland, 1777, being for some years in Braelochaber; went to Nova Scotia, 1802, and worked in Arisaig, N.S., 1802-16; died suddenly in Halifax, N.S., 15th April 1816.

(Of fourteen Scots priests who went to Nova Scotia between 1790 and 1854 to work among the immigrants from the Highlands, nine had been students in Valladolid.)

1771 [3rd February, via London and Bilbao]

- 4. JOHN GORDON. (Lowland District) Born at Landends in the Enzie, the son of Gordon of Munmore; having completed the course, left, unordained, 1779; joined the army and was killed in America, 1781.
- 5. GEORGE MATHISON. (Lowland District) Born at Fochabers on 12th January 1756; arrived in Valladolid from Scalan; ordained priest, 19th September 1778, and left for Scotland (via Bilbao), 12th October 1778; was priest at Auchenhairig, where died, 14th January 1828.
- 6. LACHLAN McINTOSH. (Highland District) Born at Braemar in 1753 and went to Scalan, 18th July 1770; left Valladolid, unordained, 1778, and went to Corunna and from there, in a dejected state, to the Canary Islands (or Madeira); there, he had a serious illness and a narrow escape from death; sailed to Lisbon, walked to the Spanish border and had just enough money to take a carriage to Valladolid, where he was re-admitted to the college early in 1781; ordained priest in Segovia, 1782, and returned to Scotland; was missionary in Glengairn for sixty-three years, until his death on 3rd (or 9th) March 1846.
- 7. JOHN MacHATTIE. (Lowland District) Born in the Enzie; left, unordained, April 1774.
- 8. ALEXANDER REID. (Lowland District) Born in the Enzie, a nephew of William Reid (missionary); arrived in Valladolid from Scalan; left, unordained, April 1774.
- 9. ALEXANDER GRANT. (Lowland District) Born in the Enzie, a relative of John Geddes; left, unordained, January/February 1774.

1771 [23rd February, via Santander]

- 10. JOHN MacDONALD. (Highland District) Born at Menteith, Perthshire, 1751/52, of Arisaig parents; converted to Catholicism while at Buorblach seminary, N. Morar; ordained priest, 10th July 1776, and remained in the college to teach humanities until 1784, when returned to Scotland; for short periods in Moidart and Barra, and then in Arisaig until his death, 7th July 1834.
- 11. AUSTIN MacDONALD. (Highland District) Born at Drimore, South Uist; having received diaconate, returned to Scotland, 1777, and was made a master at Buorblach until ordained priest, 1780; sent to mission of Strathdown to succeed Alexander Cameron I; died at Scalan, 1782.
- 12. DONALD MacDONALD. (Highland District) A nephew of Allan MacDonald (master in Valladolid college); left, unordained, 11th July 1776; joined the army and, during the assault of Badajoz in April 1812, he was killed, along with three hundred men of the Portuguese regiment which he commanded.
- 13. RANALD MacDONALD. (Highland District) Born in Glengarry, 1754; ordained priest in San Ildefonso de la Granja, summer 1780, and left for Scotland, August 1780; worked in Morar for sixty years, until death, 25th December 1840.
- 14. ARCHIBALD MacDONALD. (Highland District) A nephew of MacDonald of Keppoch; left unordained, April 1774; joined army, became commandant of the Invalid Battalion, and died, 1813.

15. ANGUS MacDONALD (Highland District) born in Lochaber; left, unordained, 20th May 1776; enlisted in the Spanish navy and died at El Ferrol, 1780.

1774 [24th August]

- 16. JOSEPH HENDRIE. (Lowland District) Born in Edinburgh, a nephew of Bishop Hay; arrived in Valladolid from Scalan; left, unordained, January 1782, and went to Paris, via Barcelona (instead of, as expected, to Rome to meet Bishop Hay); went to Scots College, Douai, but left, unordained; emigrated to America.
- 17. JOHN GORDON. (Lowland District) Born in the Enzie, 1760, a nephew of John Geddes and cousin of John Gordon, the rector; arrived in Valladolid from Scalan; completed the course, returned to Scotland, and was ordained priest by John Geddes, 18th December 1784, in Edinburgh; first procurator at Aquhorties, 1799-1807; died in Aberdeen, 8th December 1823.

1774 [28th October]

18. ANGUS CHISHOLM. Highland District) Born in Strathglass, 1759/60, the brother of Bishop John Chisholm; ordained priest, 1783, and remained to teach humanities until 1787, when went to Douai as prefect of studies; returned to Scotland, 1789, and missionary in Strathglass; elected coadjutor to his brother, 1804, and consecrated titular Bishop of Diocesarea, by Bishop Cameron, 15th September 1805, at Lismore; succeeded his brother as vicar apostolic of the Highland District, 1814, and rebuilt the seminary at Lismore; died at Lismore, 31st July 1818.

1775 [c. 25th May, via Carron and El Ferrol, by "Dorothy"]

19. ALEXANDER MacDONALD. Left, unordained, October 1778.

1776 [22nd August, via Carron and El Ferrol, by "Earl of Denbigh"]

- 20. JAMES ST. CLAIR. (SINCLAIR) (Lowland District) Born in Edinburgh; arrived in Valladolid from Scalan; left unordained, October 1777; inherited £ 1,000, spent it, went to Canada, returned to Scotland, inherited more wealth; was in army from, at least, late 1781 until late 1783 (and was an officer, stationed in Dijon, in July 1783).
- 21. ANGUS MacDONALD. (Highland District) Born in Retland, S. Morar; arrived in Valladolid from Scalan; ordained priest and left for Scotland, May 1782; sent to Kintail and died at Abertarf from an illness contracted while visiting the sick, 14th April 1784.

1777 [6th August, via Carron and El Ferrol, by "King of Spain"]

- 22. JAMES STEWART (alias TORRY). (Lowland District) Born in Aberdeen; arrived in Valladolid from Scalan; a "solitary and melancholy" person, he left, unordained, 1778; was a schoolmaster in Aberdeen for many years.
- 23. ANDREW DAWSON (or DEASON). (Lowland District) Born in Strathbogie, 1762/64; ordained priest and left for Scotland, 1785; missionary at Shenval until 1787 and then superior at Scalan seminary until death, from tuberculosis, at Huntly, 2nd September 1788.

- 24. ANGUS BERNARD MacEACHRAN (MacEACHAN, MacEACHERN). (Highland District) Born at Moidart, 8th February 1759, the son of Hugh MacEachran; arrived in Valladolid from Samalaman seminary; ordained priest, 20th August 1787, and returned to Scotland where he was missionary on various islands in the Hebrides; went to Prince Edward Island, 1790; consecrated titular Bishop of Rosen (with jurisdiction over New Brunswick, Cape Breton Island and Prince Edward Island), in Quebec, 17th June 1821 (Alexander MacDonell, no. 27, being one of the co-consecrators); became Bishop of Charlottetown (with jurisdiction over New Brunswick and Prince Edward Is), 1829; died at Charlottetown, 22nd April 1835.
- 25. ANGUS McGILLIVRAY. (Highland District) A nephew of John MacDonald, Bp. of Tiberiopolis and V. A. of the Highland District; died of an intestinal complaint, 4th June 1778, and was buried in church of S. Esteban.

1777 [5th December, via Genoa and Alicante]

26. PAUL MacPHERSON. (Lowland District) Born at Scalan, 4th March 1756, the son of Paul Macpherson and Jean Cumming; arrived at Scots College, Rome, 8th February 1770; for reasons of health, came to Valladolid; ordained priest by Bishop of Segovia in his private chapel, 6th April 1779, and left for Scotland, 21st April 1779; procurator of the Scottish mission, Rome, 1793-98; returned to Rome, 1814, and rector of the college there, 1820-27 and 1835-46; died in Rome, 24th November 1846, and buried in college chapel.

1778 [28th March, via Carron and El Ferrol, by "King of Spain"]

- 27. ALEXANDER MacDONELL ('Big Sandy"). (Highland District) Born at Glenurquhart, Glengarry, 1762; arrived in Valladolid from Buorblach; ordained priest and left for Scotland, 20th August 1787; worked in Badenoch until 1791 and in Lochaber until 1792, and then went to Glasgow, August 1792, to minister to the Highlanders there and become the first resident priest since the reformation; abandoned his Glasgow charge, May 1795, to become chaplain to a newly raised Catholic regiment, the Glengarry Fencibles, and was with them in Guernsey and Ireland; went to Upper Canada, 1804, was consecrated titular Bishop of Rhesina, 1820, and became Bishop of Kingston, Upper Canada, 1825/26; while on a visit to Scotland, died in Dumfries, 14th January 1840.
- 28. ALLAN MacDONALD. (Highland District) Ordained priest and left for Scotland, November 1787; worked in Barra for many years and had a reputation as a theologian and linguist; is said to have died in an Edinburgh mental asylum, February 1809.

1780 [11th February, via Edinburgh and Vigo, by Portuguese ship]

- 29. JOHN DAVIDSON. (Lowland District) Born in the Enzie; arrived in Valladolid from Scalan (which he left on 14th October 1779); completed his course, left for Scotland, 14th November 1791, and was ordained priest in Edinburgh, 15th January 1792; died in Greenock, 8th January 1815.
- 30. ALEXANDER CAMERON. (Lowland District) Born at Braemar, 1767, a nephew of Bishop Cameron; at Scalan, 31st December 1777 to 14th October 1779; ordained priest and left for Scotland, 2nd June 1793; at Drummond Castle (Perthshire) and Edinburgh, 1793-98;

- returned to college as vice-rector, 22nd August 1798, and was appointed rector, 24th May 1816; died in the college, 20th September 1833.
- 31. WILLIAM REID. (Lowland District) Born in the Enzie, 1765; arrived in Valladolid from Scalan; completed his course, left for Scotland, 14th November 1791, and was ordained priest in Edinburgh, 15th January 1792; procurator of the mission, Edinburgh, 1817-28; died in Dumfries, 18/27th March 1845.
- 32. JOHN MacDOUGAL (or GORDON?). (Lowland District) From Edinburgh or Perthshire; arrived in Valladolid from Scalars; completed his course, left the college, 14th November 1791, but was refused ordination; died in the island of St. Vincent.

1780 [26th November]

- 33. JAMES ROBB. (Lowland District) Born in Buchan; arrived in Valladolid from Scalan (having sailed from Leith, September 1780); left the college, 5th May 1785, suffering from tuberculosis; sought a cure on the Biscay coast and in Lisbon, where he died, 29th December 1785, and was buried in the chapel of the English College.
- 34. RODERIC (RORY) MacDONALD. (Highland District) Born at Garrfluich, South Uist, 1763; arrived in Valladolid, having spent a month in Scalan before sailing from Leith; completed his course, left for Scotland, 14th November 1791, and ordained priest in Edinburgh; in Badenoch, 1791-1803, and in Hebrides, 1803-28; died in the family home, South Uist, 29th September 1828.
- 35. CHRISTOPHER MacRA (MacRAE). (Highland District) Born in Kintail, 1764; arrived in Valladolid from Scalan; ordained priest before completion of course (because of ill health) and returned to Scotland, 1787; spent rest of his life in the mission of Kintail, where he died, 27th September 1842.
- 36. RANALD MacNEIL. (Highland District) From Barra, a nephew of Alexander MacDonald, tit. Bp. of Polemo and V.A. of the Highland District; arrived in Valladolid, having spent a month in Scalan before sailing from Leith; left, unordained, March 1784; joined the army and died in the East Indies.

1785 [8th September, via Leith and Oporto]

- 37. ALLAN MacDONALD. (Highland District) Arrived in Validolid from Samalaman; left, unordained, because of ill health, 1786; became a pedlar and died in Edinburgh, 8th September 1793.
- 38. WILLIAM RATTRAY. (Lowland District) Born 1763 and converted to Catholicism by Bishop Geddes; ordained a priest and returned to Scotland, 1796 (via Corunna and Falmouth); built the first Catholic church in Paisley, 1808, and later worked in Perth and also in Dundee, where he died, 1st/2nd February 1827.

- 39. JOHN MacDONALD. (Highland District) Arrived in Valladolid from Samalaman; left, unordained, 21st June 1790; worked in the cotton trade in Glasgow and died in the Highlands.
- 40. JOHN SHARP. (Lowland District) Born at Mortlach, near Huntly, 15th February 1772; arrived Valladolid from Scalan; ordained a priest, 27th September 1795, and returned to Scotland, 1796; taught at Scalan, 1796-99, and at Aquhorties, 1799-1801; one of first priests in Scotland to adopt English manner of speech; last procurator of Scotlish mission, 1828-49; first rector of Blairs College, 1829-47, when he retired, though continuing to live there until he died, 5th September 1860.

1788 [17th (?) September, via Bilbao]

- 41. WILLIAM MacLEOD. (alias McHARDY) (Highland District?) Ordained a priest and left for Scotland, 17th July 1798 (via Madrid, Badajoz and Lisbon); in Braemar, where died, of tuberculosis, 3rd June/July 1809.
- 42. EWAN MacEACHEN. (Highland District) Born in Arisaig, 1769, but brought up in Keith; ordained a priest, 1798, and remained to assist Bishop Cameron until 1st July 1800, when left for Scotland; at Arisaig, Badenoch, Lismore (where he taught for eight years), Strathglass and Braemar (twenty years); retired, 1838, and died at Tombae, 9th September 1849.
- 43. CHARLES MacDONALD. (Highland District) Born in Moidart, 17th March 1774; arrived in Valladolid from Samalaman; ordained a priest, 1798, and left for Scotland, 1st July 1798 (via Madrid, Badajoz and Lisbon); in Knoydart, 1799-1835; and in Glasgow, 1838-40; died at Borrodale, 8th October 1848.
- 44. GEORGE GORDON. (Lowland District) Born at Fochabers, 27th March 1776, arrived in Valladolid from Scalan; ordained a priest, 23rd October 1797, and left for Scotland, 1st July 1798 (via Madrid, Badajoz and Lisbon); in the Cabrach, 1809-25, and in Dufftown, 1825-56; built the church at Dufftown after the style of the reliquary chapel, Valladolid, and published several works of church music; died at Dufftown, 10th May 1856.
- 45. AUGUSTINE (AUSTIN) MacDONELL. Died of catarrhal fever, 19th May 1795, and buried in front of high altar in college church.
- 46. JOHN MacDONALD. Left, unordained, 3rd March 1796; a few years later, died in America.

1794 [c. 20th January, via coast of Brazil, whither ship had been blown, and Oporto]

47. WILLIAM FRASER. (Highland District) Born at Craskie in Glencannich, Strathglass, 1779, the son of John Fraser and Jean Chisholm; arrived in Valladolid from Samalaman; ordained a priest (2nd January 1804?) and left for Scotland, 2nd September 1804; in Lochaber, 1804-14; and a master at Lismore, 1814-22; went to Canada, to Cape Breton Is. and, in 1824, to Antigonish; consecrated titular Bishop of Tanis and vicar apostolic of Nova Scotia, by Angus Bernard MacEachern (no. 24), in Antigonish, 24th June 1827; jurisdiction extended to Cape Breton Is., 1829, and Bermuda, 1836; in 1842, his vicariate was made the See of Halifax, which was divided in 1844, Fraser choosing the Scottish part, viz., Cape Breton Is. and

- eastern Nova Scotia (the bishopric of Arichat), with his residence at Antigonish; died at Antigonish, 4th October 1851.
- 48. WILLIAM WALLACE. (Lowland District) Born near Huntly, 1767/68, the son of a non-Catholic father (who died when the boy was young) and a Catholic mother; to Scalan, 1784, and at Scots College, Douai, from 1788 until March 1793 (when it closed because of the French Revolution); ordained a priest, 1798, and remained to teach humanities until c. 22nd November 1808 when, because of the French invasion, he escorted the students home (via Corunna, in a British brig of war, to Falmouth); at Fetternear, 1809, and Stobhall, Perthshire, 1812; returned with students to Valladolid, 1816, but left for Scotland, 12th September 1818; chaplain at Traquair House, 1821 until his death there, 24th October 1854.
- 49. ALEXANDER BADENOCH. (Lowland District) Born in Newmill, 12th June 1774; at Scots College, Douai, until closed, March 1793; completed his course, left for Scotland, 17th July 1798 (via Madrid, Badajoz and Lisbon), and ordained a priest in Scotland (or before he left Spain?); taught in Aquhorties, 1798-1804, and was superior there, 1826-29; died in Edinburgh, 9th October 1836.
- 50. WILLIAM MacDONALD. At Scots College, Douai, until closed, March 1793; ordained a priest and left for Scotland, 17th July 1798 (via Madrid, Badajoz and Lisbon); after twenty years' working on mission, either left or was dismissed.
- 51. WILLIAM SMITH. At Scots College, Douai, until closed, March 1793; left, unordained, 3rd March 1796; later, known to have been in an asylum in England.
- 52. WILLIAM CHISHOLM. (Highland District) Born in Strathglass, 1775/76; arrived in Valladolid from Samalaman; ordained a priest and left for Scotland (via Santander), 1st April 1804; in charge of the mission of Lochaber, where he died, 30th May 1826.

John Gordon, Rector, 1799-1810

1803 [29th October, via Portugal]

- 53. WILLIAM CHISHOLM. (Highland District) Son of Archibald Chisholm and Isabel McKenzie; because of the French invasion, left for home, c. 22nd November 1808 (via Corunna and a British brig of war to Falmouth); deemed incapable of continuing his studies and so sent home.
- 54. DUNCAN MacKENZIE. (Highland District) Born at Lietry in Glencannich, Strathglass, 1780; left, unordained, c. 22nd November 1808 (as no. 53), continued studies at Lismore, became a master there, 1814, and ordained a priest by Bishop Angus Chisholm, 1815; sent to Aigas, Strathglass, 1818, and to Eskadale, 1825, where he died, 28th October 1828.
- 55. ALEXANDER McKENZIE. (Lowland District) From Gairnside, Aberdeenshire, the son of John McKenzie and Anne MacPherson; arrived in Valladolid from Aquhorties; remained in the college with Alexander Cameron II, when others left because of French invasion, November 1808; later, on Wellington's staff?; working in a mercantile house in Corunna, 1817.

- 56. JAMES REID. (Lowland District) From Banff; arrived in Valladolid from Aquhorties; left, unordained, c. 22nd November 1808 (as no. 53), and returned to Aquhorties, but later left, unordained.
- 57. ANGUS MacDONALD. Wanted to leave, 1805, and expelled for immoral behaviour, 1806.

A person called Macdonald arrived at the college on 24th July 1804, wore the attire of a colegial, but taught (and hoped to study philosophy and theology). He left the college, went to Madrid and then to Gibraltar, where he induced his brother to desert, was arrested and sent to the galleys for eight years. Apparently not the same person as no. 57.

- 58. JOHN FORBES. (Lowland District) Born Strathavon (or Glenconglas), Banffshire, 27th December 1791, the son of Lauchlan Forbes and Jean Stuart; arrived in Valladolid from Aquhorties; left, unordained, c. 22nd November 1808 (as no. 53); on loan to Highland District to teach in Lismore, 1814, where ordained a priest by Bp. Angus Chisholm, 15th October 1815; in Banff, 1818-27, and Elgin, 1827 until he died, 3rd September 1855.
- 59. JAMES WRIGHT (alias ARBUTHNOT). A child, American, perhaps a convert; his upkeep not a charge on the college and he left, unordained, 1808; gained a commission in the Spanish army in South America and rose to the rank of lieutenant-general in Spain; died in Corunna, 1863.

Alexander Cameron II, Rector, 1816-33

1816 [12th December, via Aberdeen and Gijón, by "Oak"]

- 60. JOHN MURDOCH. (Lowland District) Born at Wellheads, Enzie, 11th November 1796, the son of John Murdoch and Helen Simpson (and baptised by George Mathison, no. 5); arrived in Valladolid from Aquhorties; ordained a priest by Bishop of Segovia, 19th March 1821, and left for Scotland, 8th May 1821; consecrated titular Bishop of Castabala and coadjutor of Bp. Scott, V.A. of the Western District, in St. Andrew's, Glasgow, by Bp. Kyle, 20th October 1833; became Vicar Apostolic of the Western District, 4th December 1846; died in Glasgow, 15th December 1865.
- 61. JOHN BREMNER. (Lowland District) Born at Speymouth, 9th March 1799; arrived in Valladolid from Aquhorties; ordained a priest by Bishop of Segovia, 19th March 1821, and left for Scotland, 8th May 1821; an apologist and controversialist, his pamphlets being published as a book; in Paisley from 1829 until his death there, from typhus, 13th January 1847.
- 62. JAMES MacHATTIE. (Lowland District) Born 14th January 1800, the son of Alexander MacHattie and Helen Mitchell; arrived in Valladolid from Aquhorties; ordained a priest, 1822, and remained to teach humanities until he left for Scotland, 3rd May 1826; conducted a party of boys to the Scots Benedictine monastery at Ratisbon, 1830; joined the community there and was professed, 1832 ("Fr. Augustine"); died in Ratisbon, 18th June 1835.
- 63. ALEXANDER MacDONALD. (Highland District) Born in Lochaber, 1801, the son of Alexander MacDonald; arrived in Valladolid from Lismore; left, unordained, 1822, and returned to

- teach in Lismore, where ordained a priest, 1824, and left (1825?); at Moidart, 1829-38, and at Glenmoriston, 1838-41; went to Nova Scotia, 1842, and became vicar general in the diocese of Arichat, 1852; died at Mabou, Cape Breton Island, 21st May 1865.
- 64. ROBERT GARDEN. (Lowland District) Born in Edinburgh; arrived in Valladolid from Aquhorties; died of intestinal disorder, 2nd September 1818, and buried in front of the high altar in the college church.
- 65. COSMAS (COSMO) BENNET. (Lowland District) The climate being unsuitable, he left, unordained, 5th June 1822, and went to Aquhorties; probably so ill that still unordained when died in Aquhorties, 1825.
- 66. WILLIAM IRELAND. (Lowland District) Arrived in Valladolid Aquhorties; expelled, 7th 1822.
- 67. ANGUS McDONALD. (Highland District) Son of Allan McDonald and Catherine Fraser; due to ill health, left for Scotland, unordained, 5th June 1822, and ordained at Lismore, 1824; went to Nova Scotia, 1842, was at Judique, Cape Breton Is. until 1845, when his health broke down and he was cared for by the Trappists of Tracadie, N.S., until he died, 1885.
- 68. NEIL MacDONALD. (Highland District) Born in Lochaber, 1796; arrived in Valladolid from Lismore; left for Scotland, 26th September 1822, and ordained a priest there (at Lismore?), 24th March 1824; vice-rector of Scots College, Rome, for a year; then in Barra, 1825-35, Knoydart, 1835-48, and Drimnin, Argyllshire, until his death there, 12th April 1862.
- 69. DAVID DINWOODIE. (Lowland District) Born in Galloway; arrived in Valladolid from Aquhorties; due to tuberculosis, he had to leave for Scotland, 12th September 1818, where he died, December 1818.
- 70. ROBERT MILLAR left, unordained, 12th September 1818; afterwards went to Rome, became a Capuchin, then left the order and returned to Scotland; mentally unbalanced.
- 71. Identity unknown. A twelfth student certainly arrived in the college in 1816 and had left by 1818. Was he DAVID DICK, who left, November 1817? Or was this person only a visitor?

1820 [24th November]

- 72. ALEXANDER MacSWEYN (MacS WEEN). (Western District) Born at Lochgilphead, 1803, the son of Neil MacSweyn; arrived in Valladolid from Lismore; left for Scotland, 16th June 1827, and ordained a priest at Lismore; in Strathglass until 1845, when he went to Nova Scotia, dying at Boisdale, Cape Breton Is., 19th July 1870.
- 73. WILLIAM BYRNE. (Western District) Left for Scotland, 26th May 1827, and ordained a priest at Lismore; at Fort William, 1830, but later dismissed from Scottish mission; went to America, worked in Jersey City, suspended for a time, but later worked as a priest in Pittsburgh, Pa., or Plattsburg, N.Y., and died there.
- 74. RANALD RANKINE. (Western District) Born in Fort William, 21st December 1799; due to chest trouble, had to leave for Scotland, 5th June 1822; ordained a priest at Lismore, 1828, and

served in Badenoch and Knoydart; because of bad health, went to Australia, 1855, and died at Little River, Victoria, 14th February 1863.

1821 [19th December, via Lisbon and Madrid]

- 75. JOHN GEDDES. (Eastern District) Born in the Enzie, April 1807, a grandnephew of Bishop Geddes; arrived in Valladolid from Aquhorties; due to ill health, left for Scotland, 9th June 1826, finished his course at Aquhorties, and ordained a priest at Blairs by Bishop Kyle, October 1829; at Perth until his death there, from tuberculosis, 8th January 1832.
- 76. ANDREW MURDOCH. Born at Banff, 24th January 1808; arrived in Valladolid from Aquhorties; due to ill health, left for Scotland, September 1822, went to Aquhorties and there died, from tuberculosis, spring 1823.
- 77. JOHN McLACHLAN. (Northern District) Born at Banff, 12th February 1804, the son of John McLachlan and Helen Grant; arrived in Valladolid from Aquhorties; ordained a priest, 1829, and left for Scotland, 11th May 1829; took some boys to Ratisbon, June 1838, and remained there until June 1839; at Preshome, Huntly, Keith and Inverness before going to America (probably 1852), where he died, 25th October 1856.

1826 [18th August]

78. GEORGE SMITH (SMYTH). Born in England, 28th May 1804; arrived in Valladolid from Aquhorties; left, unordained, 19th March 1828; went to America and became a Methodist preacher.

[16th September, via Liverpool and Corunna]

- 79. JAMES McKAY. (Eastern District) Born at Nether Clashnore, Glenlivet, 25th March 1802/03, the son of Peter McKay and Elizabeth Tam; arrived in Valladolid from Aquhorties; ordained a priest in Zamora and left for Scotland, 11th May 1829; after nearly forty years on the Scottish mission, went, 1863, to St. Bernard's Abbey, Leicester, where he died, 19th April 1884.
- 80. CHARLES GRANT. (Western District) Born in Glenlivet, 26th November 1806, the son of Alexander Grant and Catherine Stewart; arrived in Valladolid from Aquhorties; left for Scotland, 4th May 1829, and ordained a priest there; died in Glasgow, 19th April 1837.
- 81. WILLIAM GORDON. (Western District) Born at Tomintoul, 24th January 1808; arrived in Valladolid from Aquhorties; left for Scotland, 4th May 1829, sent to teach in Blairs, and ordained a priest at Preshome, February 1831; priest in charge at Greenock from 1852 until his death there, 15th December 1880. 82.
- 82. DONALD WALKER. (Western District) Born in Glengarry, 1808; arrived in Valladolid from Lismore; ordained a priest in Valladolid, April 1833, and left for Scotland; died in Port Augustus, 27th October 1838.
- 83. ALLAN McLEAN. (Western District) Born at Arisaig, 6th May 1804, the son of Alexander McLean and Catherine McVarish; arrived in Valladolid from Lismore; ordained a priest in

Cuéllar, 28th May 1836, and left for Scotland, 2nd September 1836; in Barra (twelve years), South Uist (four years), Fort Augustus (two years); went to Canada, 1854, and worked in Cape Breton Island, being in Judique, Cape Breton Is., from 1857 until his death there, 1st October 1877.

- 84. ANGUS GILLIS. (Western District) Born in Moidart, the son of Alasdair Gillis and Mary Cameron; arrived in Valladolid from Lismore; expelled from Valladolid, 9th June 1837, but admitted to Blairs, 1838, and ordained a priest at Preshome, 30th January 1840; served at Braemar, Chapeltown and Glenmoriston before going to Nova Scotia, 1846, where he died, 5th October 1851.
- 85. JAMES EGGO. Born in Kincausie, Kincardineshire, 27th April 1813, the son of John Eggo and his wife, Jean; arrived in Valladolid from Aquhorties; left, unordained, 22nd July 1831, and later went to sea.
- 86. ALEXANDER G. GRANT. Born in Aberdeen, 6th May 1814, the son of George Grant and Margaret Gregory; arrived in Valladolid from Aquhorties; left, unordained, 9th July 1834, and emigrated to Montreal, 1835, where he died, 1897.

1833 [11th September]

87. CHARLES GORDON. (Northern District) Born at Clashnore, Glenlivet, 13th April 1813, the son of John Gordon and Jean (Gordon ?); arrived in Valladolid from Aquhorties and Blairs; ordained a priest, 9th June 1838, and left for Scotland, 26th June 1838; because of epilepsy, he had to retire from work, first to Tombae and later to Belgium, where he died at Courtrai, 30th January 1864.

The national seminary of Blairs opened in 1829 and the district seminaries of Aquhorties and Lismore ceased to exist. From this time until 1933 inclusively, practically all the students at Valladolid had previously spent some years at Blairs, a point it was not considered necessary to make explicit in the subsequent entries of this register. The students were sent to Spain when the rector "called for a colony".

- 88. ROBERT GRANT. A cousin of Alexander G. Grant (no. 86); left, unordained, 4th October 1835, and admitted to Blairs, where he died from tuberculosis, spring 1837.
- 89. JOHN McDONALD. (Eastern District) Born at Auchendown, Banffshire, 25th May 1813, the son of John McDonald and Elizabeth Gordon; ordained a priest, 9th June 1838, and left for Scotland, 31st July 1838; while priest in charge of St. Patrick's, Edinburgh, died of typhus, 27th January 1866.
- 90. GEORGE RIGG. (Eastern District) Born at Crochmore, Kirkpatrick Irongray, Kirkcudbrightshire, 19th July 1814, the son of George Rigg and Isabel Caven; ordained a priest, 9th June/25th July 1838, and left for Scotland, 31st July 1838; worked in St. Mary's, Edinburgh, 1838-78 (except for eight years in Perth, 1856-64) and made vicar general, 1877; on restoration of hierarchy, nominated Bishop of Dunkeld and consecrated in Scots College, Rome, by Cardinal Howard, 26th May 1878; died in Perth, 18th January 1887.

- 91. VALENTINE CHISHOLM. (Western District) Born in Strathglass, 5th May 1817, the son of John Chisholm and Margaret McRae; ordained a priest, 26th March 1842, and left for Scotland, 16th April 1842; priest in charge of St. John's, Glasgow, 1855-82; died in Bridge of Allan, 28th October 1882.
- 92. JAMES SMITH. (Western District) The son of George Smith and Margaret Donaldson; ordained a deacon, 26th March 1842, left for Scotland, 16th April 1842, ordained a priest in Scotland, 1842; priest in charge, Hamilton, 1847-50, and Newton Stewart, 1851.

John Cameron, Rector, 1833-73

1838 [19th December]

- 93. JOHN THOMSON. (Northern District) Born at Aberdeen, 14th February 1822, the son of John Thomson and Anne Gordon; left because of ill health, 1st June 1843, readmitted to Blairs and ordained a priest there by Bp. Kyle, Easter 1846; died at Aberdeen, 10th November 1886.
- 94. JOHN SUTHERLAND. (Northern District) Born 1821, the son of James Sutherland and Charlotte MacRonald; left because of ill health, 8th April 1843, but, with health restored, went to Blairs and ordained a priest there, 15th March 1846; canon and provost of the Aberdeen chapter; died in Huntly, 7th January, 1894.
- 95. ALEXANDER MacRA (MacRAE). (Northern District) Born in Inverness, 8th July 1821, the son of Farquhar MacRa and Anne Murchison; left because of ill health, 19th February 1844, readmitted to Blairs and ordained a priest by Bp. Kyle at Preshome, 16th March 1846; sent to new mission at Beauly but, 1851, dismissed by his bishop; went to Nova Scotia, 1853, and died, Boisdale, Cape Breton Is., 1856.
- 96. THOMAS CARLYLE. (Eastern District) Born 1815/16, the son of Robert Carlyle and Margaret Rigg; left because of ill health; 1st April 1846, but later ordained a priest in Scotland; died, 1856.
- 97. WILLIAM LOGGIE. (Northern District) Born at Buckie, 4th June 1821, the son of William Loggie and Isabel Geddes; "ordained" a priest, 13th April 1846, and left for Scotland, 18th April 1846; died at Tynet, 29th May 1885.
- Nos. 97, 98 and 102 were the unfortunate victims of two attempts, both of doubtful validity, which the Bishop of Valladolid, Dr. José Antonio de Rivadeneira, made to ordain them. They were conditionally re-ordained when they returned to Scotland.
- 98. WILLIAM GRANT. (Eastern District) Born in Braes of Glenlivet, 1821, the son of Alexander Grant and Margaret (Grant?); "ordained" a priest (see above), 13th April 1846, and left for Scotland, 18th April 1846; having recovered from smallpox and typhus contracted in Dumfries, died of cholera, in Stirling, 6th February 1849.
- 99. ARCHIBALD McDONALD. (Eastern District) Born in Perth, 16th November 1821, the son of Allan McDonald and Anne Cleghorn; dismissed from the college, 12th February 1845, but

- completed his course in St.-Sulpice and ordained a priest by Bp. Gillis in Blairs, 17th October 1847; vicar general in the Eastern District, 1864-69; died in Dumfries, 26th January 1877.
- 100. JAMES MacPHER5ON. Left, unordained, with tuberculosis, 16th April 1842; died, 1844.
- 101. ALLAN MacDONALD. Died, from inflammation of the lungs, 5th October 1842, and buried in public cemetery, Valladolid.
- 102. DONALD McEACHAN. (Western District) Born in Arisaig, 31st March 1822; "ordained" a priest, (see above) 13th April 1846, and left for Scotland, 18th April 1846; died in Glasgow, 25th August 1886.

1842 [26th July]

- 103. JAMES DORMAN. Left, unordained, 15th November 1844.
- 104. FRANCIS O'NEIL. Left, unordained, 15th November 1844.
- 105. JAMES GREY. (Western District) Left, unordained, 17th November 1847; admitted to Blairs and sent, 1850, to College of Propaganda Fide, Rome, where he died, shortly afterwards (8th April 1851?), of smallpox.

1843 [29th September]

- 106. ALEXANDER MUNRO. (Western District) Born in Aberdeen, 17th October 1820, and converted to Catholicism by Rev. Charles Gordon, 1838; a printer and compositor before entering Blairs, 2nd August 1841; ordained a priest, 24/29th March 1849, and left for Scotland, 24th April 1849; after four years in Duntocher, returned to Valladolid as professor, 20th May 1853 to 16th April 1861; while there, wrote *Calvinism in its Relations to Scripture and Reason* (Glasgow 1856); after five years in Paisley, transferred to St. Andrew's, Glasgow, where he spent the remainder of his life; received honorary doctorate of theology, made a canon and first provost of the cathedral chapter (1884), and domestic prelate (1888); died in Glasgow, 23rd November 1892.
- 107. HENRY McVEIGH. (Northern District) The son of Patrick McVeigh and Helen O'Hare; left, unordained, 9th September 1847, and went to Madrid where he taught English.
- 108. HENRY GALL. (Northern District) Born at Aberdeen, October 1828, the son of John Gall and Barbara Cruickshank, and a convert to Catholicism; left, unordained, 9th November 1847, readmitted to Blairs, 14th December 1847, and ordained a priest by Bp. Kyle at Preshome, 25th March 1852; because of ill health, went, in 1874, to England, then to Belgium and, finally, to Paris, where he died, 17th September 1891.

1846 [2nd July]

109. DAVID McCARTNEY. (Eastern District) Born in Edinburgh, 18th June 1826; left, unordained, 9th November 1847, readmitted to Blairs, 14th December 1847, and ordained a priest by Bp. Carruthers, 3rd May 1851; died in Dalbeartie, 30th September 1906.

- 110. PETER CUMMING. (Eastern District) Born at Scalan, 25th March 1827, the son of John Cumming and Jean McPherson; ordained a deacon at Palencia, 27th March 1852, left for Scotland, 16th April 1852, and ordained a priest by Bp. Kyle at Preshome, 24th May 1852; died in Crieff, 6th February 1875.
- 111. WILLIAM ROBERTSON. (Northern District) Born at Keith, 13th May 1829, the son of William Robertson and Elizabeth Dawson; ordained a deacon in Palencia, 27th March 1852, left for St.-Sulpice to complete his course, and ordained a priest in Paris, 21st May 1853; died at Fochabers, 9th July 1857.
- 112. JOHN GRANT. (Northern District) Born 4th April 1830; left, unordained, 9th November 1847, went to Blairs, but left there also.
- 113. WILLIAM RUTHERFORD. (Eastern District) Born 25th May 1831; dismissed, 8th June 1847.
- 114. HUGH McDONALD. (Western District) Born 14th April 1830; at his own request, sent to Blairs, 16th March 1848; left there, unordained?
- 115. WILLIAM CUMMING. (Western District) Born in Tomintoul, 7th March 1831; left, unordained, 16th March 1848, but, 1849, resumed his course in France (Aire, Monteuil, Cambrai) and ordained a priest by Bp. Murdoch in St. Andrew's, Glasgow, 10th May 1856; died of tuberculosis in Rothesay, 24th December 1860.
- 116. CHARLES BENNET. (Northern District) Born 7th October 1835; left, unordained, 16th March 1848.

1847 [20th May, through France, by train]

- 117. GEORGE BENNET. (Northern District) Baptised, 25th May 1828; left, unordained, 8th June 1849, went to Issy and to St.-Sulpice, but left there, unordained.
- 118. JOHN COLL. (Western District) Born of Irish parents, 16th May 1829; left, unordained, 7th November 1851, with the intention of joining the Scots Benedictines in Ratisbon; was ordained a priest for the Diocese of Hexham and was working in Darlington, 1862-63; was teaching English in Vienna,
- 119. WILLIAM SMITH. (Northern District) Born in the Enzie, 11th May 1830, the son of Alexander Smith and Helen Bennett, older brother of George Smith, Bishop of Argyll and the Isles, and a cousin of Alexander Smith, coadjuto r in the Western District; ordained a priest in Palencia, 30th May 1854, and left for Scotland, 12th June 1854; died, Enzie, 20th June 1898.
- 120. HUGH CHISHOLM. (Western District) Born in Strathglass, 19th October 1830, the son of Nicholas Chisholm and Mary McDonald; ordained a priest in Palencia, 30th May 1854, and left for Scotland, 12th June 1854; Canon and provost of Glasgow Chapter; at St. Mirin's, Paisley, from 1881 until his death there, 24th June 1908.
